

# Chicken Farm Blueprint Chicken House



## Key Elements

- Face in an East to West direction (length wise). This will stop wind and direct sun from getting in.
- Be well ventilated.
- Be open on both long sides, with curtains that can be rolled upwards.
- Have a foot bath in front of the entrance.
- Have a solid foundation and cement floor.
- Have good biosecurity – rodents or birds should not be able to enter.
- Consider adding a roof catchment and water tank to your chicken house.

## Dimensions

The size of the house will depend on the number of birds you intend to keep.



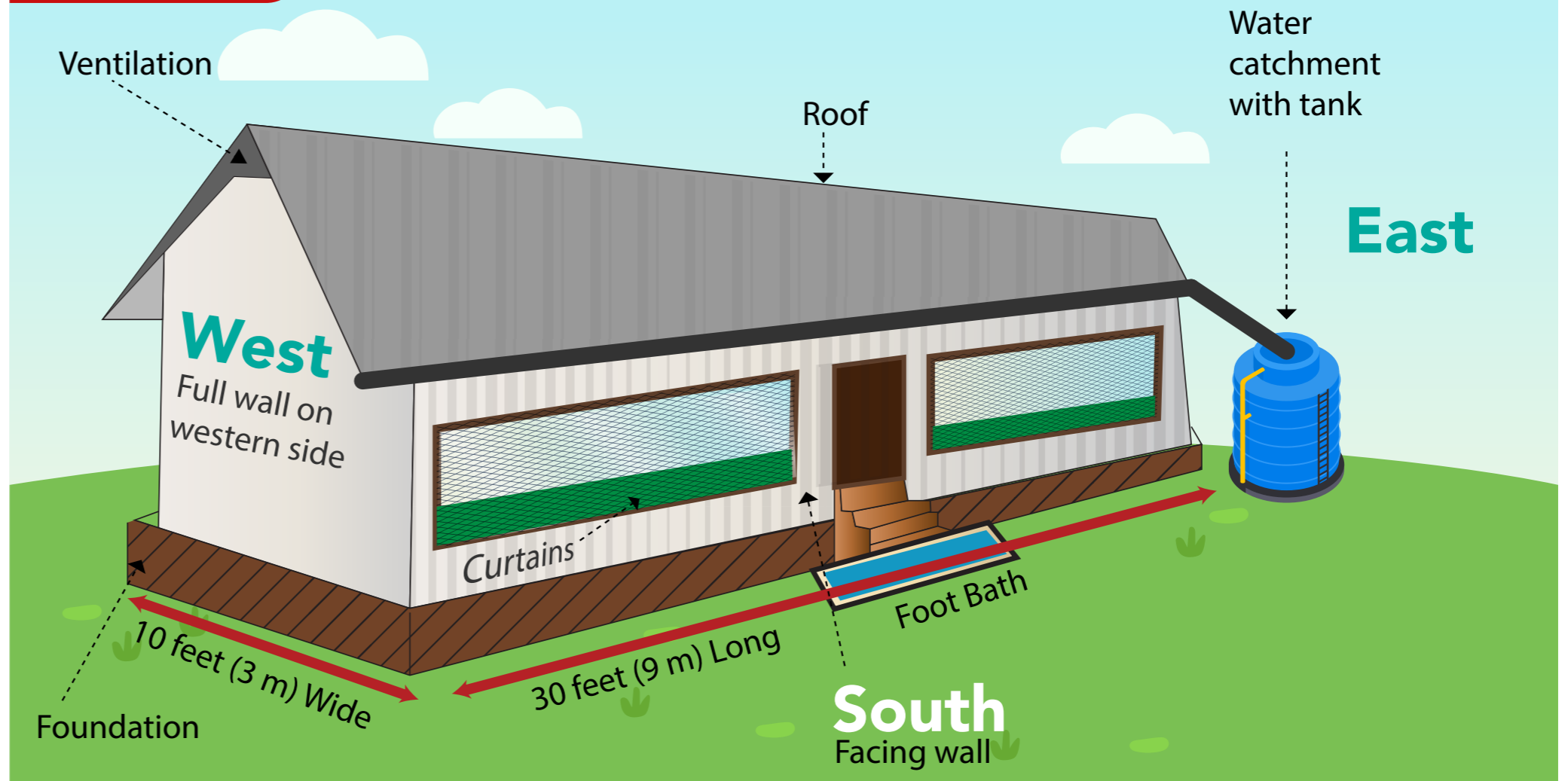
- Each Broiler Chicken needs a space of 1 x 1 ft.
- Each Layer chicken / Improved Kienyeji Chicken needs a space of 1.5 x 1 ft.

If you want to start with a small number of birds, and intend to expand, it's best to build a bigger house.



**Remember:** Make sure you build a well-ventilated chicken house that has enough room for the number of chickens that it houses.

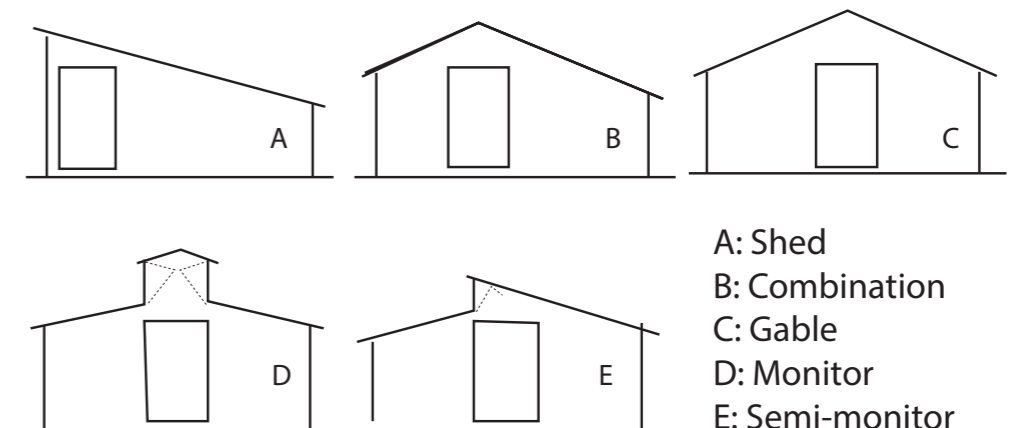


### Example A

## Chicken Farm Layout



### Guide

If you are farming chickens at a large scale, it's a good idea to have several chicken houses.

Here is a layout which can help you plan your chicken farm. →

### Characteristics

- 1 x General store and office
- 8 x Chicken houses (each 10 x 30 ft / 3 x 9 m)
- 1 x Feed mill / store
- 1 x Incinerator (a machine for burning waste material, especially industrial waste, at high temperatures until it is reduced to ash)

### Getting Started

If you don't have all the money right away, you can start small:

- Build as many houses as you can afford
- Build a store

Then with time you can:

- Add additional houses
- Add an office
- Add an incinerator

It makes sense to plan ahead if you want to expand your business in the future.
